Ministry of Health Care of Ukraine Comments on Abortions

"Of course, 200,000 is a terrifying number..." said Vyacheslav Kaminsky, M.D., the Head OB/GYN of the Ministry of Health Care of Ukraine.

"... 200,000 abortions are children that were meant to be born", said the doctor.

Even though the government provides maternity stipends until babies reach the age of 3 and government policy is pro-life, abortions remain the primary birth control method in the impoverishing Ukrainian nation.

Unfortunately, it is also the best source of income for the underpaid OB/GYNs of the state clinics (from \$20 to 190 USD depending on the term and method). This sets up a conflict in goals.

"There is a fight for a client between the doctors" shared one of Zhitomir OB/GYNs in a private conversation with our counselor.

Having diagnosed pregnancy, the first question doctors ask is "Shall we abort?" say most of the women receiving help from MTU.

And so again we ask you to support us in our fight for the unborn: "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

Pray for us to find new ways to reach abortion-minded women.

Pray for OB/GYNs to realize the horror of abortion and open up for pro-life cooperation.

A Story of a Life Saved

One of my Lifesavers women called me to let me know that tomorrow her friend had scheduled an appointment for an abortion. She gave me her friend's phone number and asked me to do something to stop her. I began to think hard about how I could approach this woman and not turn her away from the very beginning.
